Ahhhhh. Take a deep breath. The business of the first half of the church year, with all but one of the church festivals—and frankly, Christ the King is Advent adjacent—over and done with. Time to settle into ordinary time. The long green season, where nothing special happens, right?

By no means, as our friend Paul would say. "Ordinary" time refers not to the long summer (or winter for the southern half of the world), but ordinal. Numbered Sundays, or even better ordered days of the calendar, when we are set free to explore the life of Jesus through the Gospel assigned to the year by the Revised Common Lectionary, for those who use that system.

Each of the synoptic Gospel writers—Matthew, Mark, and Luke—tells a slightly different story, from a unique perspective. To understand the rest of the year's holy seasons, we need to walk alongside Jesus, as he teaches, preaches, prays, and heals. Without this foundation, the rest—especially Lent and Easter—lose some of their impact and meaning.

So, if you're tempted to spend more of this summer attending "St. Mattress of the Sheets," also take time to explore the Gospel of Matthew. Think about how Jesus is distinct or the same. Think about what it means for your faith walk. But please, do show up. It's important for your whole community, and to quote Ricky Bobby, it makes Baby Jesus smile.
