#### **PASTOR'S REPORT:**

Update on Sabbatical Leave: Pastor Rachel requested a Sabbatical Leave to commence Mar. - June 2023 funded by a Lily Grant. The Grant request was not funded so Pastor Rachel will not be taking Sabbatical Leave in 2023 and will re-apply for the Lily Grant for 2024.

The pastor, Rev. Dr. Staples was contacted by Pastor Rachel and warmly accepted the support. Over 20 members at HPC attended various Sunday morning church services at FSBC through Aug. 21, 2022. A \$1,000 donation was made to First Shiloh Baptist church on behalf of HPC through the Pastor's discretionary fund. May we continue to build friendships and worship with our brothers and sisters in Christ for such a time as this and always.

He noted that pledge giving is behind through August which is typical. Other giving is ahead of last year. Spending is currently under budget. Predicting yearend total giving is difficult due to the last two years of COVID but at this point, the projection is to be about 10% under budget at year end.
