HPC Pumpkin Patch 2022

Since 2010, Hamburg Presbyterian Church along with 1,000 other churches & organizations around the country have partnered with a Non-Profit organization called, Pumpkin Patch fundraisers, to raise money for charity.

This organization has helped facilitate our wonderful pumpkin patch every year. This year we have raised over \$14,000 to go to charity, local food pantries.

In addition, this organization supports the Navajo nation who grow the pumpkins and has for many years. In doing this fundraiser, for the past 12 years, we have raised over \$100,000 to go to the Navajo nation, as well as, over \$50,000 to go to local food pantries, Eden, Union Blasdell, St. Peter & Paul and Operation Good Neighbors.

Also, we have partnered with the deer rescue in Springville, NY and they receive all of the leftover pumpkins for free.
