

The Story of Buffalo's Michigan Street Churches

One street, with so much history. In 1816, of the 400 Buffalo residents, 16 were African Americans, 9 of whom were enslaved (a reminder that enslavement was not confined to the southern states). But, by 1828, there were 60 Black residents and amazing things were soon accomplished. The Vine Street African Methodist Episcopal Church (on Michigan Street) was established in 1831 and Michigan Street Baptist Church in 1836 (its first building was constructed in 1844-45 in large part by members). These churches, however, were not just symbols of security for their members. They felt called to stand against the sin of enslavement.

In 1842, Michigan Street Baptist Church passed a resolution that condemned slavery saying it was "opposed to the spirit of the Gospel." Over the years, they helped hundreds of the enslaved as a stop on the Underground Railroad.

In 1843, Vine Street AME church hosted the National Negro Convention where Presbyterian minister

Henry Highland Garnet (a Presbyterian minister) and Frederick Douglas debated whether force was the
right way to overthrow the institution of slavery, a significant moment in the Abolition Movement.

In 1901, a member of Michigan Street Baptist Church, Mary Talbert, led a protest against two exhibits at
the Pan American Exhibit: Darkest Africa and Old Plantation because they included demeaning (and inaccurate) portrayals. Then, in 1905, Ms. Talbert and her husband William offered their home to W.E.B. DuBois for the first meeting of the Niagara Movement Conference, the forerunner of the NAACP. Ms. Talbert, with her church's support, later became the chair of the national NCAACP Anti-Lynching Committee,
which worked for the passage of the Dyer Anti-Lynching Bill, which tragically failed to pass the Senate.

Ms. Talbert once said, "It should not be necessary to struggle forever against popular prejudice."

MINUTES OF SESSION FEBRUARY 2022

The Rev. Rachel Brown, Moderator, called the meeting to order with prayer at 7:02 p.m. A quorum was present. The agenda was approved as written. MOTION to approve the minutes of January 10, 2022 was presented and approved.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Rachel Brown informed Session that she informed the Worship and Music team that pulpit supply will be needed on 2/20, 3/13, 4/24, 8/21, 11/20. An update on the potential Pastor's sabbatical was provided by Rachel this week via email. The application process for the Lily grant is extensive and the effort is in process. Pastor Rachel Brown will now be moderating the Session of East Aurora Presbyterian Church since their recent pastor has retired.

CLERK'S REPORT: Tony Cimorelli informed Session that the annual statistics report was submitted. He mentioned that Cheryl Koelmel has volunteered to update the membership picture directory. He also informed Session that we have been informed that church annual meetings cannot be done in a hybrid format based on New York State law. Only all virtual or in person meetings are allowed. He has also completed the Church Sexual Harassment Training Class completed.

DEACON'S REPORT: Elyse Perry provided the Deacons Report. Highlighted several programs and activities including Hal returning to walking to church, that the flower program input has been ongoing and that their meetings have been moved to the third Thursday of the month.

COMM. TO PRESBYTERY: The next Presbytery Meeting is not until May 2022. No representative required at this time.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Blair reviewed the January report. There were no noticeable trends to mention at this time. No questions were asked. Blair asked we all think about ways to spend 55K of savings on major repairs. (Example parking lot expenses.) He also reminded us of the Memorial Funds to be spent.

MOTION: "Building & Grounds makes a motion to expense \$1,000 to renovate the $\frac{1}{2}$ bath adjacent to the Sanctuary". Motion approved.

MOTION: Church Life moves that the Annual Meeting of the Congregation be held on Sunday, July 10th, 2022 at Chestnut Ridge Park, Shelter 3, in conjunction with the worship service and church picnic. Motion approved.

BRINGING THE PROMISE OF LIFE TO THE BORDER As if coping with the pandemic wasn't difficult enough, last year pummeled native Venezuelan Paola M. and her family with devastating news. Her father was diagnosed with a rare type of stomach cancer for which a high-risk surgery was needed. A desperate internet search resulted in a name, Gabriela Zavala, and when Paola connected with Gaby, it made all the difference. Paola said, "I was able to contact Gaby [Zavala] and explain the situation we were going through. She guided me by giving me some options, among them the option of immigrating to the United States where they could perform my father's medical treatment." Although their decision to seek entry into the U.S. was by no means an easy one, Paola saw it as their only choice to literally save her father's life. Paola's family is just one of thousands who make treacherous journeys in search of help and hope. As the needs at the border continue to escalate, Gabriela is grateful for the generous gifts of Presbyterians, which help the Resource Center maintain its presence. She says, "A lot of times if it weren't for us, people would not have the resources they need to escape dangerous situations." One Great Hour of Sharing is the single, largest way that Presbyterians come together to work for a better world by advancing the causes of justice, resilience and sustainability. During Lent, we celebrate that God connects with us through Jesus' resurrection and connects us with those "who have the least" — and that's what One Great Hour of Sharing is all about.


